Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Have you ever wanted to be part of something bigger? Even the most independent among us likes to make changes and have an impact on others. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus demonstrates one of his most iconic miracles — the multiplication of the loaves. It is a sign of the institution of the Eucharist, when we are fed not by bread but by the Body of Christ.

Jesus, being God, acts using his own power. The multiplication of the loaves is a prime example not only of Jesus' power over nature, but of the way he equips his disciples.

First, Jesus asks Philip a question “to test him.” Jesus has seen the crowds and “he himself knew what he was going to do,” but he wants his disciples to start thinking about the problem and its solution. Andrew offers a suggestion, though he isn't confident in it. “There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?” Jesus honors Andrew's suggestion, takes the offered loaves, and delegates the Apostles to bring order to the crowd. When the crowd has been fed, the Apostles “gather the fragments left over.” In the process, they discover with wonder that bread has been produced in super abundance.



In the sacraments, God works through simple matter to make grace real in our lives. He works in and through us as well. Are you facing problems that could have spiritual solutions? Is there a need in your parish or community that you could meet? Whatever our hesitations, Jesus honours our simple loaves and fishes. He invites us to participate in his generous work of redemption, just as we are.

Mission Co-op: On the weekend of August 4/5, at all Masses, Rev. Msgr. Eugene Pereira will be speaking about the works and the needs of the **Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India**. Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. 90% of the people are traditional fishermen who depend on fishing for their livelihood and 10% are farm workers who are recent converts from the low caste Hindus. Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in this community. The Archdiocese depends on outside assistance to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists and to continue its development programs for the community. **However, on November 30, 2017, several coastal villages of the Archdiocese were hit by Cyclone “Ockhi”. More than 289 young fishermen drowned in the sea while doing deep sea fishing. There is so much sadness and devastation in their villages. Many young Catholic families lost their men and everything they had. We are looking for emergency assistance to help the children especially, with food, clothing and shelter. Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In an on-demand society, it's not always easy to imagine life with less. The crowds of Jesus' day depended on the weather and successful growing seasons for their livelihood. For many of Jesus' listeners, even “food that perishes” would have been a welcome relief. Jesus acknowledges this but tries to draw them deeper. “You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.” For people who have just witnessed a miracle, the response is strangely marked by ingratitude. “What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert.” Jesus fed them for one day, but Moses interceded with God for 40 years of bread. “Jesus,” they seem to say, “can't you just give us more?”



How often do we behave similarly in the spiritual life? “If I only I had more patience, then I could be kind to her.” “I could be welcoming if I was more outgoing, but that's just not me.” “I know I'd be a better parent if I just had more time.” Like the crowds, we want Jesus to give us more. We always don't want him to completely shift our paradigm. Perhaps it's not “more patience” we need, but a deeper sense of our own imperfections for a greater sense of empathy. Maybe God is inviting you not to entertain an entire group, but to seek out the quiet person on the fringe. And time may limit you from family engagement, but could God be asking you to reorder your priorities entirely?

After all, it wasn't more loaves that the people needed. Jesus is “the bread of life,” who sustains our most essential needs. This week, are you looking for more or are you looking for God Himself?

Children's Liturgy Volunteers Needed!

Children's liturgy is designed to introduce our parish children to the Word and allow them to participate fully in the liturgy. On a rotating schedule, the Children's Liturgy volunteer leads the children in an age-appropriate liturgy of the Word downstairs in the church hall during the Sunday 9:30 Mass. Using the materials supplied by the program, and their own creativity, they provide age-appropriate liturgical readings and activities with the children from approximately age 3 until after the child's First Communion. The Children's Liturgy Volunteer accompanies the children downstairs to the church hall after the presiding priest has addressed them. The lesson takes place until after the Creed has been recited. The children then bring up the gifts and collection before returning to their families. This is a very creative, but skillful position. Since there is involvement with children, a police background and vulnerable sector screen are necessary, and these forms are supplied by the church. Orientation is provided prior to inclusion on the schedule. Please consider being part of our ministry.
