

What Is God Asking of You?

For World Youth Day — We pray the World Youth Day in Lisbon will help young people to live and witness the Gospel in their own lives.


Praying and Working for Peace: On August 6 & 9, 1945, the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki were ravaged by atomic bombs. Speaking to victims of this atomic warfare, Saint John Paul II said: "It is with deep emotion that I greet today all those who still carry in their bodies the signs of the destruction that was visited on the day of the unforgettable fire. What you endured has also afflicted a wound on the heart of every human being on earth. Your life here today is the most convincing appeal that could be addressed to all people of goodwill against war and for peace.... We are indebted to you for the living and constant appeal for peace that you are." (Nagasaki, February 26, 1981)
