

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

It begins! Jesus is doing something new. "He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea." Jesus leaves his family, his profession of carpentry, and everything he has known and loved for the previous 30 years. He goes because it is time. Something new is beginning, and Jesus will not begin it alone. "As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers ... he walked along from there and saw two other brothers." What does he say to these men? "Come after me." These words are for Peter and Andrew, for James and for John. They are also for all of us.



"Come after me." The adventure of discipleship will be strange, wild, and unexpected. The Apostles surely didn't know what they were getting into. But the invitation is accompanied by a promise. "I will make you fishers of men," Jesus tells the first Apostles.

No more will their priorities be limited to this particular village, to the square miles of the Sea of Galilee. Their eyes will be open to the kingdom of God, and their priorities will shift. Most of us will not be called to roam the countryside, but we are invited to a similar shift of priorities. "Come after me," Jesus says. "At once they left their nets and followed him." Drop the nets of what you've demanded your life to be. Drop your self-seeking priorities. Drop your concept of religion as a Sunday obligation and no more. Drop your disregard for those outside your immediate social sphere. Whatever it is that keeps you from seeing as Jesus sees, from loving as he loves, start to drop it today. Because the kingdom of God is waiting for your yes!

CATHEDRAL APPEAL- January 2020 Update

We are now at the midpoint of our 18-month Cathedral Appeal. As of January 15, 2020 our appeal has raised \$777,399.49 in cash donations and \$97,068.72 in outstanding pledges. This brings our **total raised to \$874,468.21** or 73% of our \$1,200,000 goal. 43 of our 44 parishes have remitted & reported donations to the Diocese. 20 of our 44 parishes have reached their target. Feast of St. Blaise- Blessing of Throats: The special blessing of throats associated with St. Blaise is due to a miracle attributed to him. While in prison, he miraculously saved a boy choking on a fish bone. Early in the sixth century, evidence exists in the Eastern Church that Blaise was prayed to for ailments of the throat. To this day, his feast is a holy day in the Eastern Church. In the ninth century, veneration of St. Blaise came to the Western Church and became very popular. Blessing of the throats with crossed candles began in the 1500s, the height of devotion to St. Blaise, and that blessing is still part of the devotion of the Catholic Church. **If you would like to participate in this tradition, Fr. Chad & Deacon Jim will bless throats following all weekend Masses of Feb 1/2.**

The 28th World Day of the Sick will be celebrated on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Tuesday, February 11, 2020.

The World Day of the Sick focuses on three themes. It reminds the faithful to pray for the sick; it invites us to reflect upon the meaning of human suffering; finally, it recognizes and honours all persons who work in the health care field. In Pope Francis' Message for the 28th World Day of the Sick, "Come to me, all you who labour and are
